

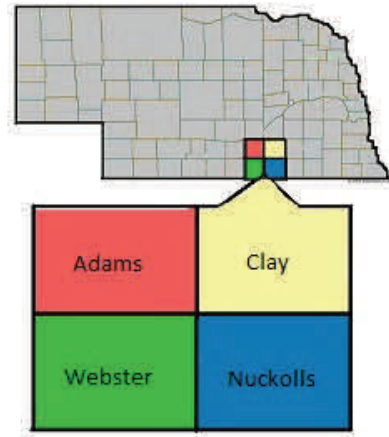

United Way of South Central Nebraska provides results you can see. Here are just a few examples of the services provided to your community:

4020 residents were provided with current, easily accessible information for individuals and families who were dealing with substance abuse and recovery issues through ASAAP's Lending Library

248 children were matched one-on-one with positive adult role models who are their friends and mentors through Big Brothers Big Sisters

567 youth participated in programs that build character, citizenship, and develops personal fitness through Boy Scouts programs

81 children were provided trained, court appointed, community volunteers to advocate for them to provide a quick, safe, and permanent home through CASA of South Central Nebraska.

33067 sack lunches were provided to needy families by Catholic Social Services

179 children were provided child care in a safe and educational environment by the Child Development Council (Pooh Corner)

676 individuals received education, resources and support for the purpose of preventing abuse, neglect, and violence toward children through Community Action of Mid-Nebraska's C.A.R.E program

2000 individuals received monthly supplemental food packages through Community Action of Mid-Nebraska's C.S.F.P program

570 residents received support with personal finances, Homeless Prevention Assistance, free income tax preparation, food bank savings, weatherization, transportation, and WIC through Community Action of Mid-Nebraska's Homeless Prevention Program.

505 individuals received public transportation by Community Action of Mid-Nebraska's R.Y.D.E Program

280 individuals participated in adult education programs with Hastings Literacy Program

150 family caregivers gained the tools, knowledge and confidence they need to continue caring for a loved with special needs right in their own home by Hastings Respite Care

148 families received home parenting assistance through Healthy Beginnings.

112 individuals received education to support them after they completed an intensive treatment program at Horizon Recovery and Counseling Center

3421 received armed forces, disaster, and health and safety services through the American Red Cross.

40 youth experienced love, trust, safety, and encouragement that they would not have experienced in a typical camp setting as children of abuse and neglect through Royal Family Kids Camp.

580 individuals received support, guidance, and education through the SASA Center for a life free of domestic and sexual violence

120 homebound seniors received a nutritious meal delivered to their home by Senior Action.

\$9,770 in gas vouchers was given to families with children who were urgently transported to hospitals away from home to treat illnesses by the Special Children's Fund

58 youth received the support and guidance needed to attend school on a regular basis by STARS

63 youth were matched with positive mentors through Teammates

88% of the 12-18 year olds who participated at the YWCA The Zone homework assistance programs raised or maintained grade averages
