

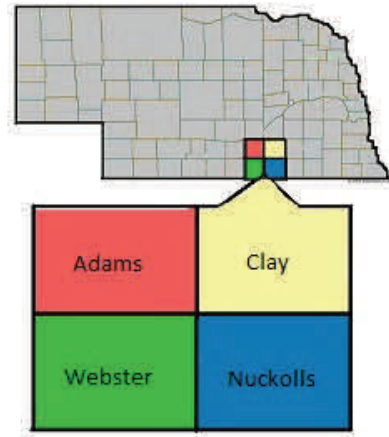

The Agencies and Programs of the United Way Invested \$71,985 in Webster County in 2010

United Way of South Central Nebraska provides results you can see. Here are just a few examples of the services provided to your community:

577 residents were provided with current, easily accessible information for individuals and families who were dealing with substance abuse and recovery issues through ASAAP's Lending Library

62 children were matched one-on-one with positive adult role models who are their friends and mentors through Big Brothers Big Sisters

43 youth participated in programs that build character, citizenship, and develops personal fitness through Boy Scouts programs

5 children were provided child care in a safe and educational environment by the Child Development Council (Pooh Corner)

68 individuals received monthly supplemental food packages through Community Action of Mid-Nebraska's C.S.F.P program

25 residents received support with personal finances, Homeless Prevention Assistance, free income tax preparation, food bank savings, weatherization, transportation, and WIC through Community Action of Mid-Nebraska's Homeless Prevention Program.

4 families received home health visitation services by registered nursing staff through Good Beginnings

11 individuals participated in adult education programs with Hastings Literacy Program

2 family caregivers gained the tools, knowledge and confidence they need to continue caring for a loved with special needs right in their own home by Hastings Respite Care

14 families received home parenting assistance through Healthy Beginnings.

11 individuals received education to support them after they completed an intensive treatment program at Horizon Recovery and Counseling Center

190 received armed forces, disaster, and health and safety services through the American Red Cross.

6 youth experienced love, trust, safety, and encouragement that they would not have experienced in a typical camp setting as children of abuse and neglect through Royal Family Kids Camp.

13 individuals received support, guidance, and education through the SASA Center for a life free of domestic and sexual violence

\$9,770 in gas vouchers was given to families with children who were urgently transported to hospitals away from home to treat illnesses by the Special Children's Fund

58 individuals received services from Y.W.C.A of Adams County
